Usually, the machine selection comprises pallet jacks, forklifts and cherry pickers. Generally, a heavy equipment operator is needed to be certified by regional or local agencies. Some are cross-trained and certified to operate a variety of different equipment kinds. Others choose to specialize in operating just one type of equipment and just need periodic updates on their operating permit certifications.

Employees in this business are often trained through a formal apprenticeship course offered by companies or unions or else with on-the-job training. Some trade and technical schools offer paid training courses. It is vital that employers hire completely-trained heavy equipment operators in order to adhere to local guidelines and adhere to regional and local laws regarding worker safety and job conditions.
