Forklift License Whitby - Acquiring a forklift certification or forklift license in North America will require the trainee to do classroom instruction in addition to hands-on training. The state, provincial and federal regulatory bodies are responsible for the training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators. Operators could obtain a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. In any case, regulatory requirements should be met. Recertification is required every two to three years.

The forklift is a powered industrial machinery that is designed together with many alternatives, like for instance sit-down and stand-up models, electric and propane versions, and various types and sizes to meet the industrial requirements of workers. Operator training courses are normally individualized to address the specific uses and types for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down lift truck inside a warehouse setting would not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered lift truck in a shipyard. The different forklifts and their applications makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all businesses and equipment. Regulatory standards, therefore, tend not to concentrate on detailed course requirements but instead on the results of individual training courses.

On the job training that is offered by the employer is the most common way of forklift training certification and licensing. The employer who provides this method of certification is needed to offer practical training and classroom sessions on equipment at their place of work. Employers may opt to train employees on each and every type of forklift separately, or to train them on all machinery combined. The curriculum incorporates forklift operation methods, lift truck maintenance, safety procedures and company regulations. Subject matters particular to the worksite, such as hazardous materials or conditions, must be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely operate and use each and every type of forklift on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor usually requires an on-site component with hands-on practice.

It must be noted that certifications provided by an employer do not transfer from one employer to the next. Receiving a forklift license through employer-provided training allows the operator to operate a lift truck for that employer only.

The most vital factor of forklift license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements vary from one type of machine to another. Safety issues differ from employer to employer, and from industry to industry. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers might have to address additional requirements for safety training in applicable industries, like for example in marine and offshore uses.
