The safety training is vital as well as the communications training which helps the crew on the ground be able to always communicate with the operator.

Because of the extreme environments these machinery work under, they are usually put under incredible strain on a regular basis. This means there are a lot of heavy equipment jobs available for the maintenance and repair of the machines. Operators of heavy machinery are highly trained workers who could diagnose, troubleshoot and repair heavy machinery in a work shop or on site. Mechanics should be ready to transport their tools to a job site and perform repair and maintenance in different surroundings.
